

Lutheran Church, Angel Fire, NM. Ben also serves the members of Immanuel Ev. Lutheran Church, Springer, NM. He will continue in the SMP program for another two years.

Ben is a fifth-generation rancher born and raised in northeastern New Mexico. As a bi-vocational Pastor, Ben works as Grazing Manager for Pi Diversified Inc., Eagles Nest, NM, implementing regenerative agriculture practices to improve rangeland ecology.



A note from Rev. Davis:


I am a fifth-generation rancher born and raised in northeastern New Mexico. I met my wife Rachel, from Zacatecas, Mexico, at a classical Christian college in Virginia where I studied history and she Literature and Pedagogy. In 2020 I obtained from the University of New Mexico my master's degree in US West History with a special interest in Southwestern borderlands. That spring we moved into my childhood home in Eagle Nest, joined the family business and began attending Christ Our Savior Lutheran Church in Angel Fire. In the absence of a pastor, the congregations at Taos, Angel Fire, and Springer asked me to provide pulpit supply as a layman in 2021.

My preparation for the ministry came principally from the virtues of my own family's devotional life, a background in Greek and public speaking, and a love for the unique communities in which I live and work. Rachel grew up as a pastor's kid on the mission field and has a degree in Biblical studies, as well as significant experience in youth ministry. In 2022, I enrolled in the four-year Specific Ministry Pastor Program through Concordia Seminary, St. Louis and was ordained in August of 2025. Alongside pastoral labors, I work as Grazing Manager for my parents' company Pi Diversified, Inc., implementing regenerative agriculture practices to improve rangeland ecology. Rachel works cattle, as well as teaching youth Bible courses for the church and Spanish and literature classes for the local homeschooling community.

As I step into this new calling, I am passionate about the truth that the Holy Spirit is not impersonally at work in an abstract entity known as "church." He is in fact at work in the particular lives of people who are living in a particular place at a particular time in history. It is we – these particular, foibled individuals – who He is making into the living body of Christ. In my particular ministry, I look forward to doing a great deal of visitation with the elderly, as well as ministry to the sick and dying. As we see in the Bible, age is not a safe time: we walk in danger all the way. There are great battles being fought in the consciences of individuals who are sometimes looking back on a life full of regrets. What a privilege to bring the Word and Sacrament and proclaim God's peace. I pray for the grace to plant seeds knowing that God alone brings the increase.




