

As a volunteer coordinator, she provides support for all short-term volunteers serving in the country. This includes assisting with every step of the process, from recruitment to on-the-ground logistics to future ways to serve once volunteers wrap up their service. Makia also serves as a resource for any LCMS team or individual member working in Belize. Through this work, she seeks to equip all LCMS volunteers for effective service.

Makia is from Wray, Colo., where she attends Calvary Lutheran Church. In May 2025, she graduated from the University of South Dakota with a Bachelor of Science degree in sociology and psychology, with a specialization in disaster response. In college, she worked as a student ambassador for the Admissions Department and as a residence assistant. She also worked as an assistant agricultural manager at Adler Farms from 2017 until 2025. Makia's desire to serve on the international mission field developed during a variety of short-term mission experiences, including shadowing an LCMS missionary in Europe (2024) and serving on mission trips to the Dominican Republic (2022 and 2023) and Thailand (2024). In her free time, Makia loves reading, crocheting and growing plants.

# Early Childhood Director at Trinity-Greeley RM District Early Childhood Consultant

My name is Gwen Marshall. I'm originally from western Nebraska, but my family moved to Fort Collins in the late 70's. Colorado became my summer home when I was in college.

I'm a graduate of St. John's College, Winfield, KS< and this is my 44th year as an educator (40 of them have been in Lutheran schools). My first call was to First Lutheran in Ponca City, OK, then I became part of the start-up staff at Tulsa Lutheran School.



In 1985, I moved to the Rocky Mountain District. My next call was to Mt. Zion in Boulder. While I was there, I became part of the RMD School Ministry Committee and have served with that group for all but 5 of the past 37 years. I have the privilege of representing our District at synodical events as the Early Childhood Consultant. I have also been very involved as a captain and consultant for National Lutheran School Accreditation.

My current big project is getting Colorado Shines to recognize National Lutheran School Accreditation as an alternate method of getting a quality rating. As soon as that happens, I will lead my school through the latest version of the NLSA early childhood instrument.

Shortly after I moved to Greeley, all of my family members moved away. I still love Colorado and have a wonderful circle of friends here and want to stay forever. I fill any free time with cooking or following my favorite sports teams. In homage to my childhood home, I still wear red most Saturdays and follow the football and volleyball teams. I was a Rockies season ticket holder for 25 years. I love the Colorado Avalanche and have been to all three Stanley Cup Champion parades (and I need another one in 2026).

Grace Lutheran Church, Parker is blessed to feature Dr. Jeffrey Blersch of Concordia University at our second annual organ concert on the four-manual Rodgers Infinity 480. Dr. Blersch will be playing some of his original hymn introductions and interpretations as well as various organ

literature. You won't want to miss this wonderful opportunity to listen and worship with this gifted composer and organist IN PERSON in our area, on the bench of a fantastic instrument!!!

Jeffrey Blersch is a nationally recognized organist, choral conductor, and composer of music for the church. He serves as Professor of Music at Concordia University, Nebraska, a position he has held since 2002, where he teaches organ, courses in music theory, composition, arranging, and is the conductor of the Cantamus Women's Choir. He is a graduate of the Oberlin College Conservatory of Music where he received degrees in organ performance and music education, and of the University of Michigan, Ann Arbor, where he earned the Doctor of Musical Arts in Organ Performance. His principal teachers have included Roberta Gary, Garth Peacock, and Marilyn Mason.

Best known for his creative hymn interpretations, he regularly performs hymn festivals and recitals across the United States. Performances have included conventions of the American Guild of Organists, Association of Lutheran Church Musicians, and National Association of Pastoral Musicians, as well as the Meyerson Symphony Center, Dallas, and the Kauffman Center, Kansas City. His performances have been featured on American Public Media's Pipedreams, and The Lutheran Hour.

Blersch has been an active church musician since being appointed organist of Peace Lutheran Church, Cincinnati, Ohio at age eight. His organ, choral, and piano compositions and collections, which number over 300 titles, are published with Concordia Publishing House and Northwestern Publishing House, and his original hymn tunes have been included in three hymnals, including Lutheran Service Book. He has released two compact disc recordings of his own compositions and arrangements, Resounding Alleluias, and On Christmas Night, and two Eps, Piano Duets for Christmas and Piano Duets for Easter on major streaming services.

Prior to his appointment at Concordia, Dr. Blersch served as Cantor of Trinity Lutheran Church, Peoria, IL, Associate Professor of Music and Director of Choral Activities at Concordia University, Ann Arbor, MI, and as an elementary music specialist in the Brunswick City Schools, Brunswick, Ohio. Jeff has served as a national director at large on the board of the Association of Lutheran Church Musicians and currently serves as Dean of the Lincoln Chapter of the American Guild of Organists. Jeff and his wife Carla, also an organist, have three grown children, Aaron, Ryan, and Jenna.

Since its humble beginnings in 1979, God has richly blessed the work of Lutherans For Life (LFL) and expanded its outreach efforts to include three vital ministry departments:

Word of Hope Y4Life Volunteer Relations

Through the dedication of our amazing teams and the tireless efforts of our executive and support staff, LFL has empowered thousands of congregations and tens of thousands of youth and adults to become Gospel-motivated voices For Life.

This year, financial donations and ministry gifts for Lutherans For Life are down. So, the development department of LFL created a friendly and "somewhat competitive" Lutherans For Life National Conference fundraising campaign—Changing Hearts Together—to raise \$10,000 for the vital work of LFL.

Participants were divided into four teams and assigned a color, name, and LFL director to foster a sense of camaraderie and competition.

Team Faith (yellow) was led by Michelle Bauman, Director of Y4Life.

Team Hope (purple) was under the guidance of Chrissie Gillet, Director of Word of Hope.

Team Love (red) was led by Michele Hartshorn, Assistant Director of Volunteer Relations, and Marie Fenske.

Team Life (blue) was represented by David Probst, Director of Development.

The objective of our Changing Hearts Together fundraiser campaign was for each team to raise the highest total donations of all four teams before the end of the banquet on Thursday evening. To encourage participation, members of the winning team would receive an LFL gift bag with life-affirming resources. Plus, our Executive Director, Rev. Dr. Aric Fenske, agreed to eat breaded and deep-fried Rocky Mountain Oysters if the \$10,000 fundraising goal was met.

Thanks to the generosity of our conference participants, the Changing Hearts Together fundraising campaign was an amazing success! In total, 215 conference attendees contributed 85 gifts, exceeding our initial \$10,000 goal by Wednesday afternoon and surpassing \$15,000 by Thursday afternoon. By the end of the conference on Friday morning, we had reached an incredible total of over \$22,400! To top things off, the President of the LCMS Rocky Mountain District, Rev. James Maxwell, and David Probst, Director of Development for LFL, joined Rev. Dr. Fenske in eating the Rocky Mountain Oysters!



The Changing Hearts Together fundraising campaign was a tremendous success because of the ministry partnership and unwavering commitment our participants had to Lutherans For Life and our mission to equip Lutherans and their neighbors to be Gospel-motivated voices For Life.


