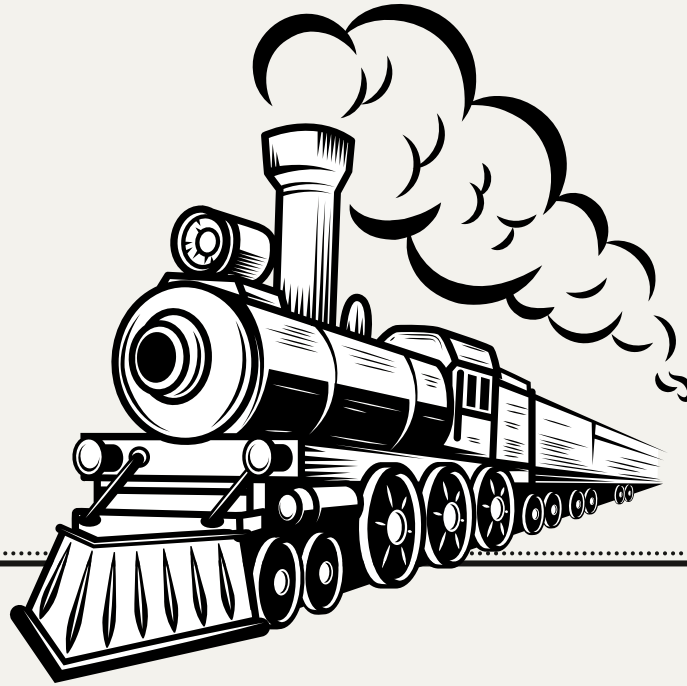

A NOTE FROM THE PRESIDENT

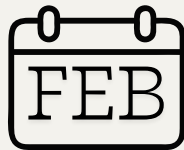

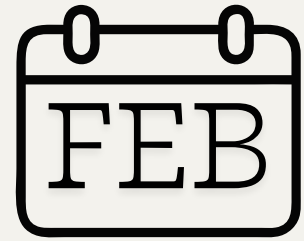

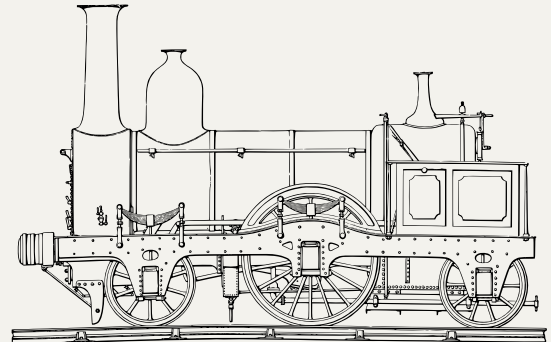
