

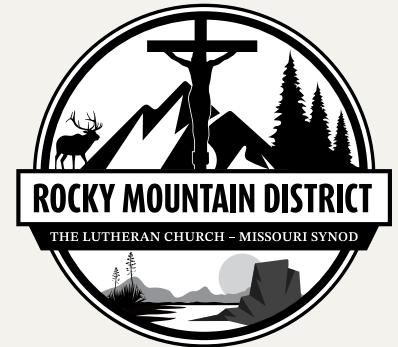
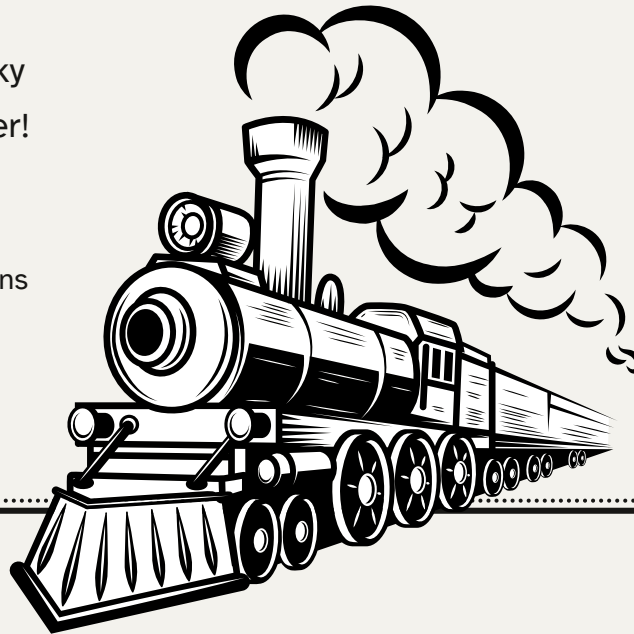

A NOTE FROM THE PRESIDENT

I still remember when I did an Epiphany devotion with my Elders before our monthly meeting. Usually, my elders quietly listen with little participation. Not so with the wise men! It was as if half of them had gone back to kindergarten and had very important things to share with their teacher: "Teacher, teacher, teacher! Suddenly half of them wanted to share with me all that they knew about the wise men and about the star - what the star could have been, how the planets could have aligned just right, how one planet dances around the other, etc...

And then to watch them admit that, no, we don't really know what that star was especially since it came to rest over the place where the child was. How does a star stop over one particular house? There are so many unknowns... And what suddenly became my new theme for that devotion was how mysterious the visit of the magi really is. We don't know if there were three. 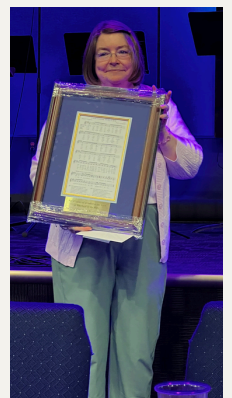


Fun Facts:
